- · Broaden cultural sensitivity, empathy, and respect for other points of view
- Foster an inclusive environment and inspire civic engagement
- Explore how artists create an artistic perspective, develop their artistic point of view, and engage with research

Spur innovation

- Exposure to a wide range of visual images, new ideas, new approaches, and artistic processes and visual aspects of design
- · Connect the creative process of art with other creative problem solving and critical thinking processes
- Stimulate ideation and risk taking
- Promote student creativity, creative participation, and creative problem solving

Promote wellness

- Develop greater mindfulness and nonjudgemental awareness
- Provide stress relief
- Respond to life and circumstances through art and aesthetic experiences
- Provide reprieve from technology with analog social activities




